Consultation sur la demande de déviation de l'Espagne à la norme EN 16686:2015

COMMENTAIRES/

Cher membre,

Le bureau technique du comité européen de normalisation a reçu une demande des autorités règlementaires espagnoles afin de rendre inapplicable les parties suivantes de la norme EN 16686:2015 "Prestations de soins d'ostéopathie", contraire à la règlementation nationale Espagnol:

- Chapitre 3 (Description de l'ostéopathie) et 4 (Pratique clinique)
- Chapitre 6.2.3 (Formation théorique et pratique, programme de type 1)
- Chapitre 6.2.3 (Formation théorique et pratique, programme de type 2)

Les textes de loi justifiant la demande sont les suivants:

- Spain. Law 44/2003, of November 21st, on the organization of the healthcare professions.
- Order CIN/2135/2008, of July 3th, which establishes the requirements for the verification of the official university degrees that qualify for the exercise of the profession of Physiotherapy

Ces éléments n'ont pas été communiqués lors de l'élaboration de la norme et ne figurent pas aux déviations indiquées en Annexe D (Déviations: Autriche, Bulgarie et Italie). Conformément aux règles de normalisation, une demande de déviation à la norme est donc proposée pour conserver le principe volontaire des normes et respecter la règlementation nationale hispanique.

EN 16686:2015 'Osteopathic healthcare provision' – UNE request for A-deviation

BACKGROUND

CEN/TC 414 'Services in Osteopathy' was disbanded by BT C45/2016 after completion of its programme of work by the publication of EN 16686:2015 'Osteopathic healthcare provision'.

On 2018-10-30, UNE submitted to CCMC the attached request for an A-deviation to EN 16686:2015.

As per BT 43/2017, A-deviations introduced after a standard has been published, require BT approval through a vote by correspondence according to IR 2 – Clause 6.1.4. The result is published as an Amendment.

PROPOSAL(S)

BT,

- noting
 - that EN 16686:2015 'Osteopathic healthcare provision' was developed by CEN/TC 414 'Services in Osteopathy', which was disbanded by BT C45/2016;
 - the request of UNE for an A-deviation to the published EN 16686:2015;
- approves the A-deviation as proposed by UNE (see BT N 11357);
- asks CCMC to publish the A-deviation as an amendment to EN 16686.

In relation to Order CIN / 2135/2008, the osteopathy is a specific method of intervention of the physiotherapy. Based on previous legislation, only physiotherapists are allowed to practice osteopathy</p>
6.2.3	<p>Spain. Osteopathic education according to Type I Programme is not allowed because it is not a healthcare professions according Law 44/2003.</p>
6.2.4	<p>Spain. Osteopathic education according to Type II Programme is allowed only as an extension of the official education established in order to CIN/2135/2008. In Spain, the osteopath is a physiotherapist with a specific education in osteopathy according to Type II Programme.</p>
